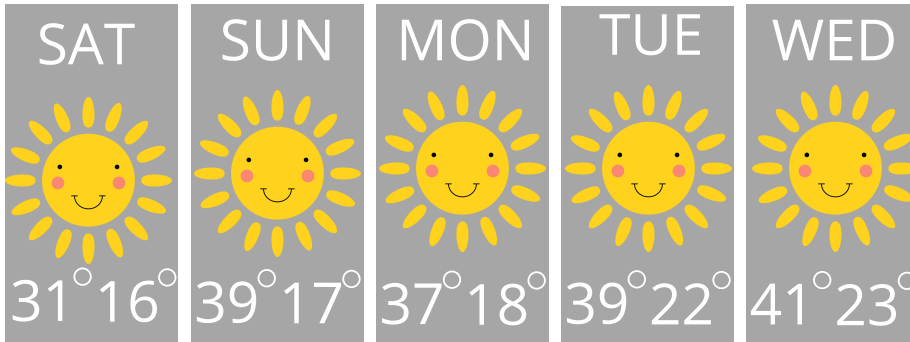

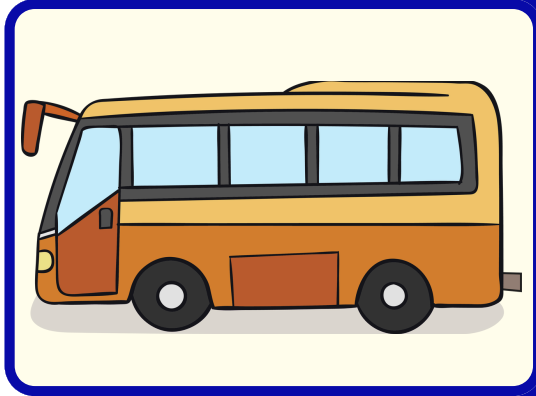

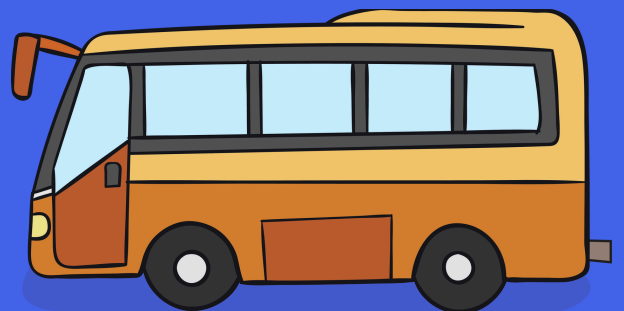

Presentation given at CBH Forum 21.2.2025

by Jon Holmes and David Bagley

Mr Chairman

Before we respond to the answer regarding the Garner Bins I'll have it noted that David Bagley and I are here as MingeneW CBH Bin Representatives speaking on behalf of the 131 growers and their drivers who deliver to MingeneW, a bin that has averaged 517,000T each year over the last 5 years.

We want to share with you our experience of trying to communicate with you, your CEO and the Board without any success, the issues of the train loading at MingeneW.

On the 4th March 2024, we sent an email to you, Simon, and Ben, and CCd all the directors. Your EA Gaynor emailed us to indicate that you had received the email but we had no reply from you or Ben. On the 24th of May, 2024 we sent another email to all directors this time, and the CEO. Again, no reply from anyone. Maybe they went to spam. This email described the issues at MingeneW and our suggested solution.

In our first email, and verbally with the Chair of Network and Engineering we asked if we could make a presentation to the June 2024 Committee meeting. We received no invitation.

Mr Chairman, we have hard copies of our document which we tried to email to you and your Board on the 24th May, 2024. We will personally hand them out to you and your Board members. Please read it so you are all informed about the issues at MingeneW. We printed 50 copies for our Growers. All have gone. The overwhelming response was positive. A numbers of Growers said to me 'that's the way to go Holmesy, but they won't take any notice of you!'

Now to the Garner Bins.

We are horrified to think your operations team will recommend to the Board that you build another 2 or 3 Garner Bins alongside the 4 current Garner Bins in Mingenew.

If this happens it will be a complete waste of money,
very little efficiency gain and

the train will continue to be split and hitched 4 times and block the main line.

Boolinda Rail crossing the only RAV 7 crossing in Mingenew which separates the sample huts and weighbridges from the unloading grids and bulk heads will continue to be blocked on 6 separate occasions stopping traffic flow for a combined minimum of 48 minutes.

When the boom gates go up, grain trucks from 3 directions and Iron ore trucks from 2 directions are all lined up waiting to cross at Boolinda Crossing.

Not exactly pathway to 2033.

Mr Chairman, your legacy for us and our grandchildren will be one of 2 scenarios

1. The continued chaotic mess when the train is loading at Mingenew or
Hopefully
2. A train that does not have to be split to be loaded, and Boolinda rail crossing is only blocked twice, once when the train is empty and once when the train is loaded.

SHIRE UPDATE February 2025

Council Meeting 19 February 2025 Visit <https://mingeneew.wa.gov.au/minutes/> to read the latest Council Meeting minutes or to listen to the recording of the meeting. Below is a list of decisions from the latest meeting held 19 February 2025;

- o *Appointment of Independent Member for Audit & Risk Committee*
 - o Ms Jane Bagshaw
 - o *Compliance Audit Return 2024*

The Compliance Audit Return (CAR) for 2024 was received and accepted, noting only one minor non-compliance matter reported.
- o *Road User Agreement – Terra Mining Haulage*

Council granted permission for Terra Mining to continue haulage operations on Shire-managed roads (Eleanor Street and Boolinda Road) up to 30 April 2026. The new Agreement proposes to include a number of conditions, including the requirement to contribute to bitumen sealing of the carpark opposite the Mingeneew Hotel.
- o *CBH Lot Amalgamation Subdivision Application*

Council is to indicate its support for the development application referred by the WA Planning Commission, for a number of lots to be purchased and amalgamated by CBH to extend their landholding. Approval is conditional on relevant roads being upgraded and maintained to the satisfaction of the local government.
- o *Appointment of Committee Member to Executive Management Committee*

As a result of Cr GA Cosgrove resigning from the Committee, Cr JR Holmes was nominated and appointment in his place, with Cr RA Starick as proxy delegate.
- o *2024/25 Mid Year Budget Review and Budget Amendments*

Council is required to undertake a budget review each year, prior to 31 March and report was presented to endorse adjustments to the Budget
- o *Annual Meeting of Electors 2025*
- o Thank you to Mrs Jill Thomas for your attendance at the Electors meeting
- o *New Council Policy – Recording of Meetings*

A new Policy was presented and adopted to outline the requirements and application of new reform provisions, requiring Band 4 local governments to record council meetings. All audio recordings will be published on the Shire’s website along with the Minutes of the meeting.

Shire staff have been working on content updates, in collaboration with Lateral Aspect to redesign the website, focusing on liveability and improving local service information, as well as maintaining the key tourism content we are well regarded for.

Transfer Station

A reminder that Mingenev Transfer Station opening hours are Wednesdays and Saturdays 10am-4pm. Access may be granted outside of these hours by appointment; please contact the Shire to arrange.

The decision to reduce operating hours was made due to the increase to waste collection fees and contract management costs associated with the new waste contract. Please note that an appropriate market testing and purchasing process was followed for the contract, and the best value achieved, however, the costs were higher than anticipated. The reduction in hours was the alternative to passing on the financial burden to ratepayers.

The Shire is investigating the installation costs and requirements for an automatic gate and security cameras to facilitate access outside of manned hours for locals and will be considered for the 2025/26 Budget.

Infrastructure Projects Update

New Childcare Centre

Construction of the new Childcare Centre should be commencing within the next month. Tunbridge Construction hope to have the pad down as a priority and the Shire will be finalising drainage and other earthworks.

Mingenew Spring

While we continue to undertake work to strengthen a business case and identifying appropriate funding to develop this space into the proposed Mingeneew Spring Botanical Garden, the crew continues to maintain the area and keep it tidy.

Water Park

Labour candidate for the Mid-West, Jenna Denton recently announced a commitment from the Labour Government that if re-elected, \$400,000 would be committed to Mingeneew for the Water Park and other key infrastructure projects.

The Shire is currently working to finalise design features and the water filtration system to formally seek quotes for this project.

Rec Centre

An application is being made under the next round of Disaster Ready funding to support the extension and upgrade of the Mingeneew Recreation Centre (as an Evacuation Centre).

The Shire has already received funding under the TC Seroja Community resilience funding and we hope to gain the additional funding to get the best value for money outcomes for the community.

Tennis Club Lighting Upgrade

As announced last month, the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries has granted \$22,140 through the Club Night Lights program to upgrade the lights at the Mingeneew Tennis Club. This project is scheduled to commenced after the end of the summer season and will be completed by June 2025.

Cenotaph Upgrade

The Shire has applied for funding through the Department of Veterans' Affairs Saluting their Service program to support upgrades at the Cenotaph. News of grant recipients is yet to be released. If successful, works will commence after the 2025 Anzac Day event.

Rural Roadworks

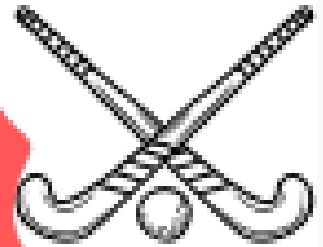
- The Shire's road crew have commenced wet grading on Depot Hill North Road.

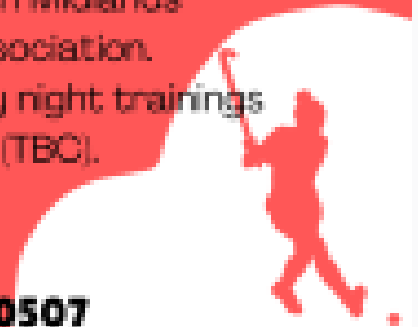

About Carmen

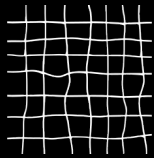

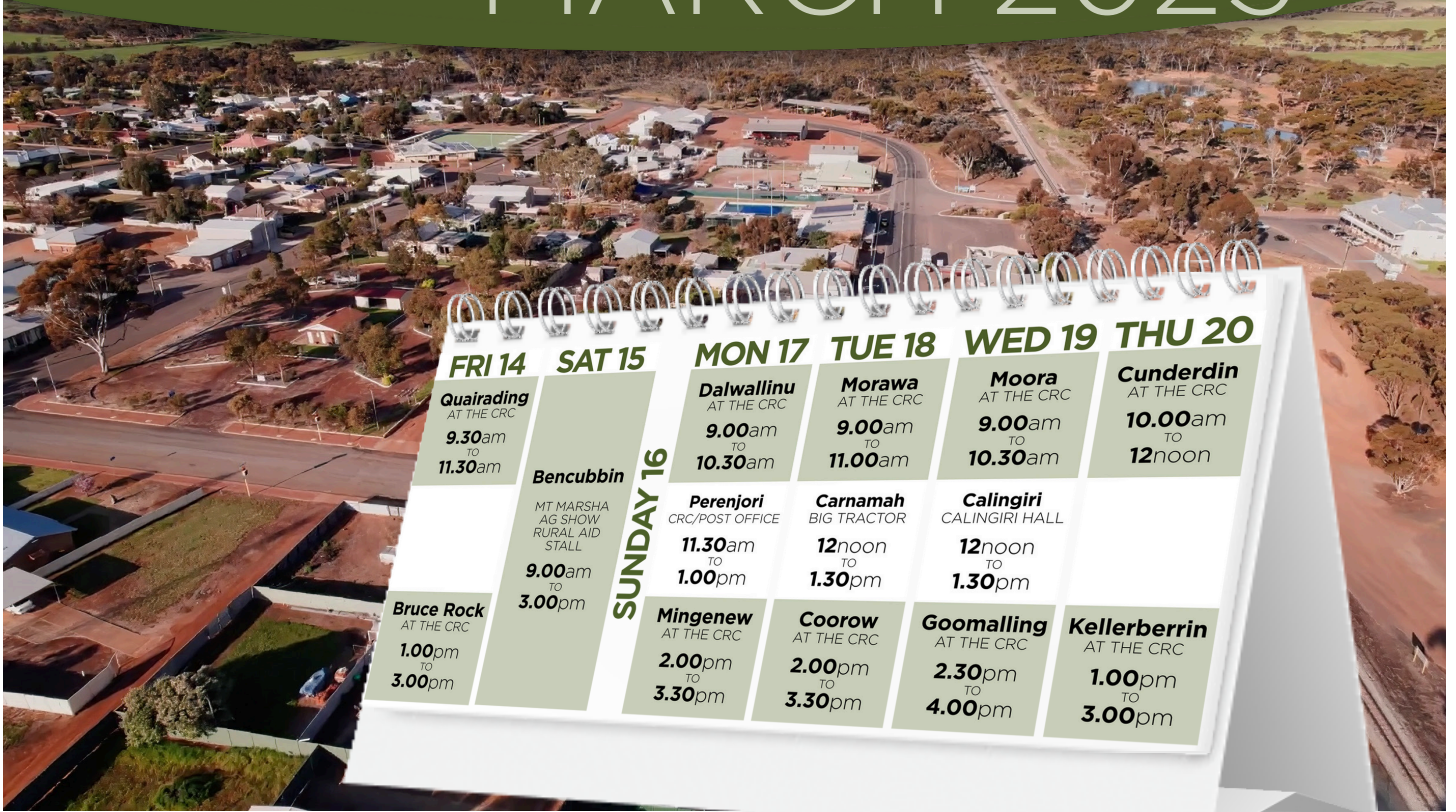

Nangetty- Walkaway Road Bridge Replacement Project

Project Background

The 60 year old Nangetty-Walkaway Road Bridge, located on the east side of the Walkaway townsite, must be replaced as it isn't engineered to meet the current needs of the transport industry in which 36.5 metre long RAV7 (Restricted Access Vehicles) road trains are now commonplace on regional roads.

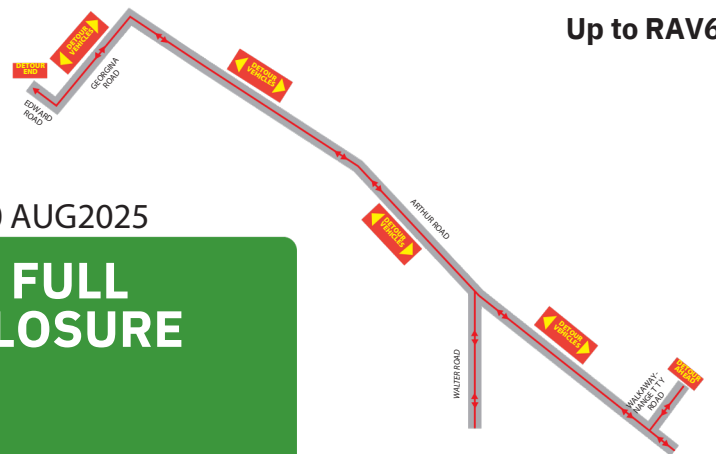

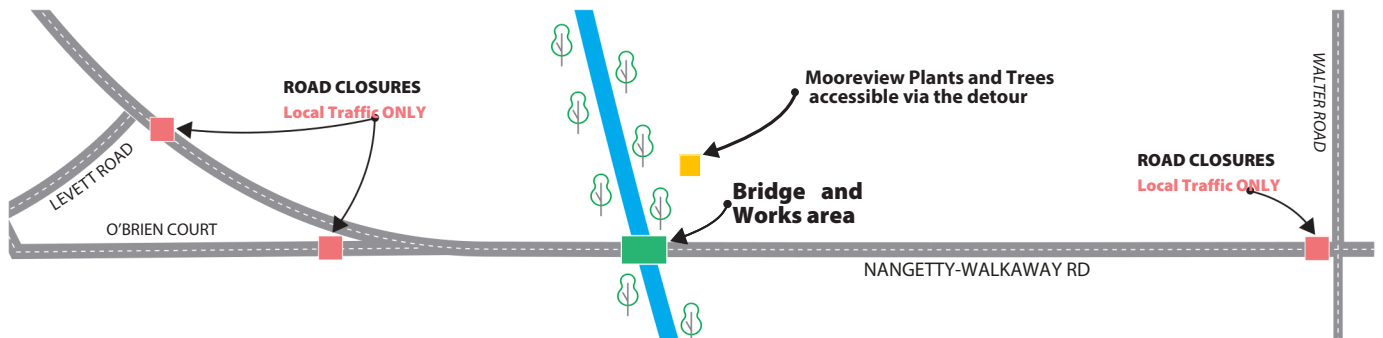

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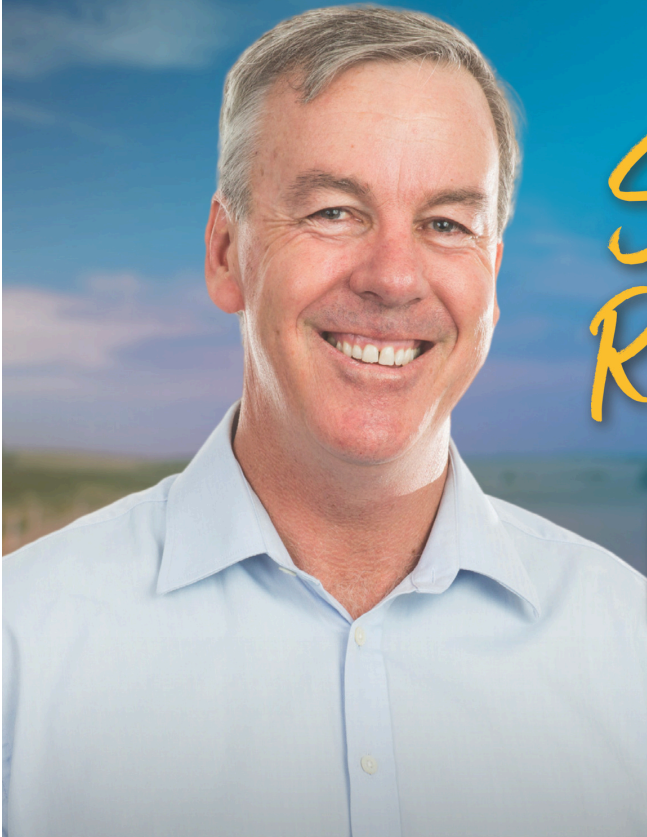
